

TAX ANALYSTS STUDENT WRITING COMPETITION GUIDELINES

ELIGIBILITY: Open to any student currently enrolled in a law, business, or public policy program. Each student may submit one paper. Co-authored papers will be accepted.

TOPIC: Submissions should focus on an unsettled question of federal, international, or state tax law or policy.

EVALUATION: Entries are blindly evaluated by our editorial staff primarily based on: originality, readability, organization, reasoning, and overall quality of content.

WINNING ENTRIES: Winning entries are published in one of Tax Analysts' weekly magazines and will be eligible to receive a 12-month subscription to Tax Analysts' daily and weekly products. Winners' names, along with their school name, will be featured prominently on Tax Analysts' website. All winning articles will remain indefinitely in the Tax Notes archives.

Winning entrants will be subject to Tax Analysts' editorial process and publication policies, including signing of an outside author agreement.

CONDITIONS: Submissions must not have been published in any other publication or forum at the time of submission. If a student accepts an offer of publication before being notified about the results of this competition, Tax Analysts must be informed immediately.

FORMAT: Entries should be a minimum of 2,500 words and a maximum of 12,000 words, including footnotes. Citations should be formatted as footnotes in accordance with the current Bluebook Uniform System of Citation. Bibliographies and reference lists are not allowed. Articles should be submitted as Microsoft Word documents.

SUBMISSION PROCESS: Entries must be submitted through the "Submit your paper" icon on www.taxanalysts.org/awards/for-students. **Please do not include any identifying information in the article.**

DEADLINE: Entries must be received no later than May 31.

NOTIFICATION: Entrants will be notified that their papers have been received within 2 days of submission, and will be notified of competition results by July 10.
